


The following poem

Did you know?

Lebor Gabála Érenn, or *The Book of Invasions* as it is known in English, is an 11th century compilation of history, myth and poetry which attempts to tell the story of Ireland. While it was written with a Christian slant, it still contains much of what we know of pre-Christian tales and literature.

Contained in its ten books is the story of the invasion of the *Melesians*, or Sons of Mil, who traveled from what we now call Spain to invade the Irish coast which had been settled by the *Tuatha Dé Danann*, a race of beautiful, magical beings. In an odd spirit of fair play, both sides agree that the *Melisians* will withdraw beyond 'the ninth wave', to allow the *Tuatha Dé Danann* time to mobilize their defense.

While the invaders are deep at sea the *Tuatha Dé Danann* call up a ferocious storm to destroy them. Instead, the *Melesian* bard Amergin uses the power of his poetry to calm the wind and allow the invaders to land. Ultimately victorious, the *Melesians* drive the *Tuatha Dé Danann* from Ireland. Popular folklore claims they were driven below ground into what came to be known as 'fairy mounds'.
