Arrows and Ales, Books and Brews

An Arts & Sciences Schola - Saturday, August 28, 2010

Let it be known throughout the land, a Schola approaches! We have many classes for the populace, covering many different skills. And the fun doesn't end there! Our Archery and Arts and Science Champions have served the Barony well, and new champions must now be chosen for our Great Barony.

Our current archery champion, Lord Ulric Bryars, will be running the archery tournament. The first round will be a timed royal round. The second round will be a hunt, and the third round will be a timed, head to head competition. If needed, there will be a head to head tie breaker.

There will be up to three prizes for any participant who completes the tourney and hits one or more of the bonus targets. In fact, it's possible for one person to claim all three bonus prizes, one per target.

The populace is invited to display their best work in our Arts and Sciences competition which will be judged by own Baron Ateno and Baroness Lassar! In order to be considered for the championship, two entries of different disciplines are required. They can be separate entries or two skills combined in a single item. An example of a combined entry would be a sample of period stitches in a period wood frame which would display both your stitchery and woodworking skills. All items must have proper documentation to be considered and Their Excellencies request that one of your entries should have a Baronial theme. It can be anything to do with the Barony, even using the Baronial colors, so be creative. We know some projects can take longer and delays happen. So if you have a project still in its "being put together stage" please bring it and enter it as a work in progress.

Our Baron and Baroness do request the populace to go easy on the ducks this year. One change from last year - brews can be entered into the Arts and Sciences competition! There will also be a separate brewing competition to be judged by Baron Master Sean de Londres.
