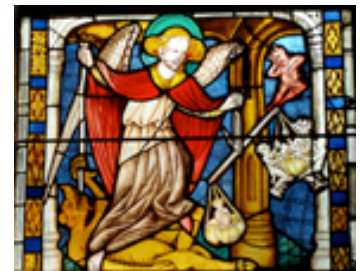


Painting In The Blank: A Scribal Workshop

This workshop will involve creating scroll blanks as a group gift to present to to TRH during their upcoming reign as TRM in the spring, and will also include materials on how to register as a scribe with the Signet Office (papers and handbooks provided), and a general introduction to the Signet Office and Backlog Signet Offices. More Sewing workshops!

Duchess Isabella wants to inform the populace that Mistress Katherine Gillesfleur and Baroness Jacqueline Helene Loisel are holding a series of sewing workshops intended to broaden your sewing skills: **Sewing - Beyond the Basics**. The workshops will be held roughly every other Sunday, beginning on March 7 (the schedule is below) and are intended to advance the seamstress beyond basic sewing skills. If you have ever finished a sewing project and thought to yourself that it is "not quite right" or "not quite what you wanted it to look like" then this is the class for you!

Directions:

Public transportation: # 4 train to the end of the line - Woodlawn station. When you go downstairs go across the street to the bus shelter and take either the number 34 or 16 it is only a short ride the bus follows along the Woodlawn Cemetery and turns on the corner of East 233rd street. As soon as you see the BP Gas Station on the left at the first light one block up) ring the bell the next stop is Napier Avenue. Cross the street and walk 3 short blocks. Our house is the one on the corner of E236th street entrance on Napier.

Driving: From the south Take your best route to the Major Deegan (87) and use exit 13 EAST 233rd Street, at the end of the exit ramp is a light go straight. At the next light make a left onto Van Cortland Park East (The BP Station is on the corner) go three blocks to Napier avenue. Our house is on the corner on the right.

Each workshop is designed to cover specific areas of sewing skills, with subsequent workshops building on the knowledge from the previous ones.

The schedule is as follows:

March 7 Materials and tools of the trade taking good measurements

March 21 Paper - Pattern drafting

April 11 Muslin - fitting

April 25 Fabric - from choosing the right fabric through construction

To be determined: Finishing - final fitting, closures, hems and seam finishes etc - this may be one or two classes depending on need.

All workshops will be at the home of Baroness Jacqueline and Baron Luigi (Luigi and Jackie Kapaj) at 4291 Napier Avenue, Bronx NY 10470. While the workshops will begin at 12:00 Noon, there will be time for socializing - the serious work starts at 1:00PM.

Local Museum Exhibits of Interest:

In these tough economic times, remember to check with museums to see if they have any options for free admission. Many local museums have free or reduced admission prices at specified hours, and many Suffolk libraries offer free passes for admission to specific museums on specific days. Check with your local librarian for further details or do a quick search on the Suffolk Web: <http://suffolk.lib.ny.us/> Enter 'museum passes' in the search field to find out if your library offers passes.

We are lucky enough to live near Manhattan, home to some of the world's most valuable illuminated manuscripts. Both The Cloisters in upper Manhattan and The Morgan in midtown have regular displays, and for the next several months we will have the opportunity to see two of the most beautiful manuscripts ever created: The Hours of Catherine of Cleves, currently at the Morgan (free admission after 7 PM on Fridays), and the Belle Heures of Jean de France, Duc de Berry, due to be displayed at the Metropolitan Museum of Art beginning in March. Of particular note is the exhibit of drawings by Bronzino, court painter to Duke Cosimo I de' Medici of Florence. It will present nearly all the known drawings by, or attributed to, this leading Italian artist. The exhibit runs from Jan. 20 - April 18, 2010.

For those keeping track of upcoming exhibits at the Met, keep your eyes peeled in March for their much anticipated show, "The Art of Illumination: The Limbourg Brothers and the Belle Heures of Jean de France, Duc de Berry." If you can't make the exhibit in person, you can catch on online lecture given by a Met curator here: <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=6LKYPRZkDF0>

Another wonderful site from the Met is a blog dedicated to the plants and gardens of The Cloisters. Explore the role of plants and gardens in medieval life and art, learn how to find and grow medieval herbs and flowers, discuss the long histories of many familiar garden plants, and discover which roadside weeds were once valued medicinals. Medievalists.net is a website for people interested in the Middle Ages. This includes scholars, writers, historians, readers and anyone who enjoys medieval history or culture. Linked to both Facebook and Twitter, the web site serves as a central online hub for news, resources and videos on medieval topics. Coinciding with the special exhibition, Demons and Devotion: The Hours of Catherine of Cleves (January 22 through May 2, 2010), **The Morgan Library and Museum** has mounted an online exhibit of one of the most important and lavish of all Dutch illuminated manuscripts of the 15th century. Long ago, the Hours were split into two separate books. When The Morgan acquired both books, plans were made to re-bind the pages into a single book in their original order. Since bound medieval manuscripts can only be exhibited two pages at a time, this is a once in a lifetime opportunity to see almost all the illuminations contained in the Hours. The only ones not shown are the ones on the backs of some of the displayed pages. While you can take a look here: <http://www.themorgan.org/collections/works/cleves/default.asp>, don't miss the opportunity to view these up close while they are at The Morgan.

Finally, for a good laugh while learning something interesting about **medieval arms and armor**, check out **How To Mount a Horse in Armor and Other Chivalric Problems**, another filmed lecture from the Met on YouTube: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=NqC_squo6X4 There is some great footage here of real men wearing real (not reproduction) armor demonstrating range of motion and flexibility of period armor. There are also some great moving images of Dr. Tobias Capwell of the Wallace Collection running at full tilt, and

pole fighting in his own custom made suit of armor. The film and lecture completely bust the myth of the slow moving knight in heavy armor.
