# Dotted Arms & Fancy Faire

Saturday, June 11, 2011 Hosted by the Canton of Hawkes Reache

Spring has flowered into summer once again and Baron Ateño of Annun Ridge and Baroness Lassar Ingen Aeda travel the lands of An Dubhaigeainn to collect their tithes on the way to the Pennsic War. The Canton of Hawkes Reache welcomes them with a Summer Faire complete with TWO fencing Tournaments including a Pas D'Arms Tournament to select the new Baronial fencing champion. There will also be a tournament to name the new Baronial Thrown Weapons Champion! There will be games and activities for all. (Additional martial activities to be announced.) Merchants are most welcome to help us get in fine shopping form for Pennsic! So bring your chairs and blankets to take respite upon the lawns, watch the fencing activities, and visit with old and new friends.

There will be a hearty day-board served throughout the day. While no feast will be served, fear not! None shall leave hungry, as the table has groaned under the bounty of our day-board these past four years! The fencing list shall open to competitors at 11 a.m.. There shall be two fencing Tournaments: the Hat Tournament and the Pas D'Arms Tournament.

Prior to the Hat Tournament, we will hold the ever-popular Hat Auction, benefiting the Baronial Rapier Community where the populace can bid for a fencer represented by their hat. If that rapier fighter wins the Tournament, the bidder wins a prize. The format of the Hat Tournament will be the decided by the day of the event.

The second Tournament is a Pas D'Arms contest which is based on a demonstration of period skill. Everyone is welcome to participate and there is a strong emphasis on pageantry. Each fencer in the Pas D'Arms Tournament must be introduced by a herald. It is expected that each herald will be vividly "over the top" (as in *A Knight's Tale*). A prize and recognition will be awarded for the best heraldry.

The demonstrations of both skill and pageantry will help Their Excellencies to choose the next Baronial Champion from the An Dubhaigeainn participants, and the overall Tournament Champion from all participants.

There will be two additional fund raising auctions: one to raise money for the Barony and a second to support the charities of the late Eric Johnson. (Wulstan of Ravenswood)

**Directions:** Take your best route to Route 110 North into Huntington Village (Approx. 4 miles from Route 25, Jericho Tpk.) Make left onto Main Street (Route 25A) then make first right onto Wall Street. Continue on Wall Street for 3/4 mile, to Southdown Road. Make a left onto Southdown Road and follow the signs to Browns Road. There will be a stop sign at the corner of Browns Road and Southdown Road. Turn right onto Browns Road. For those who are interested in **military history**, there's an interesting new site in its beta testing stage: **Conflict History** - it's an interactive map of historical conflicts across the globe. It has some neat features, including a timeline broken into five year intervals, a selection of maps that allows you to toggle between flat and terrain views, and a quick link to a short information page on each battle. Try typing any battle or war in the search box and the timeline and map will shift to give you a quick insight into that particular conflict.



For the gamers out there, there's a new board game called *The Road to Canterbury*. Based on characters from Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*, the game casts each player as The Pardoner in a group of touring pilgrims. If you've familiar with *The Canterbury Tales*, then you know that Chaucer's Pardoner is an unscrupulous clergyman greedy to profit from the sale of indulgences and fake religious relics. The goal of the game? Yup, you guessed it! Each player strives to tempt the pilgrims to sin, so that he may then profit by selling them salvation. A game of strategy, each player gambles that he will be able to profit from the pilgrims' sins before Death overtakes them, or another player manages to reap the profit from corrupting and redeeming the pilgrims. The game features beautiful period artwork from the Ellesmere Manuscript, an illuminated collection of Chaucer's stories from the 15th century, and the works of Hieronymus Bosch, the 15th century Netherlandish painter. For years people have been fascinated by the enigmatic smile of **Leonardo daVinci's Mona Lisa**. Back in 2007, scholar Giuseppe Pallanti identified Lisa Gherardini, wife of the wealthy Florentine silk merchant, Francesco del Giocondo, as the most likely model for daVinci's masterwork. While there is still some controversy over who actually posed for the portrait, a team of researchers believes they may have located the tomb of Gherardini in the now-abandoned former convent of Sant'Orsola in Florence. According to documents conserved in the Laurenziano Archive in Florence, Lisa Gherardini died and was buried in Sant'Orsola in 1542. Should her actual remains be located, her descendant, Natalia Strozzi, seems inclined to allow an exhumation and facial reconstruction of the skull, which may finally put the mystery of the Mona Lisa to rest. ## Video of the Month

Ever wonder how those Viking longships were built? This video from the Viking Ship Museum in Roskilde, Denmark takes us from how they hand-split the fresh oak into planks and then assembled them into the longboats. According to the museum website, each single plank takes 4.5 days to cleave, and this single longship reconstruction used about 90 planks made from the wood of 14 huge oak trees. The Metropolitan Museum of Art is always a delightful place to view historic art and sculpture. Located on 5th Avenue at 82nd Street, the museum has several current exhibits that might be of interest to the membership. Recently opened, Historic Images of the Greek Bronze Age focuses on the artwork discovered at the excavations of Troy and Knossos in the 19th century, while Thinking Outside the Box features European cabinets, caskets, and cases from the 1500–1900. If you're feeling flush this month, The Metropolitan Museum Members Dining Room will be serving a four course medieval tasting menu every Friday and Saturday evening through June 25 for \$59. Drawn from 14th- and 15th-century European culinary manuscripts, each course has been adapted to the contemporary kitchen while utilizing the most authentic ingredients available. Featured dishes include duck épicé with ginger-date purée and apple-saffron confiture. You can make reservations for the dinner by calling 212-570-3975. Many of the ingredients used in the menu–including fennel, mint, thyme, and rosemary—can be found growing in the medieval herb garden at The Cloisters, the Metropolitan Museum's branch dedicated to the art and architecture of the Middle Ages, located in Fort Tryon Park in upper Manhattan. (The tasting menu will be served at the main branch of the museum on 5th Avenue.)

Speaking of **The Cloisters, June 4 and 5** are a celebration of Spring at The Cloisters Medieval herb garden. Learn about **Women and the Medieval Garden**—this year's theme—through tours, family workshops, special gallery talks, and an embroidery demonstration. On **August 27** from 1-4 p.m. The Cloisters will host several weavers from the West Dean Tapestry Studio in Chichester, England who will be demonstrating a number of **tapestry weaving techniques from the early 16th century**.

While we're on the subject of herbs and medieval gardens, there will be a non-SCA herbal walk in Smithtown on June 18 from 1-4. The garden tour will focus on identifying herbal plants in the late spring garden, and there will be a discussion of their uses. Since the tour will be outdoors, please dress accordingly and be prepared with sunblock and bug repellant. Some food will be provided, so while there is no charge for the walk, donations will be gratefully accepted. # From the Coronet





Summer has arrived with its warm weather and longer days. Our annual fencing event is coming up this month, and we look forward to seeing everyone at Potted Arms and Fancy Faire on June 11 in Huntington. Thanks again to the Canton of Hawkes Reache for organizing and running this event, always a crowd pleaser. Combat practices are in full swing, and we've even been invited to practice with the fencers of Lion's End in addition to our own practices held in Belle Terre. To me, this invitation is just another example of the continuously strengthening relationship between An Dubhaigeainn and our friendly rivals at Ostgardr. Check the Combat Arts page to see the full practice schedule.



The most recent Curia at 'War of the Roses' issued some interesting organizational changes. The first lowers the minimum

age for armored combat to sixteen years of age. A parental permission form must be filled out and, of course, the fighter must be qualified by the marshals. The minimum age for fencing was dropped to fourteen with similar requirements of parental permission and qualification by a fencing marshal. The second item passed institutes term limits for the East Kingdom Coronets. The term is three years with a fourth available under certain circumstances with an extended election process. There has already been some discussion in the East Kingdom about this controversial decision. Currently, our practice in An Dubhaigeainn is to have five year terms for the Coronet, so we are very interested in hearing your thoughts about this change so that we may best represent your views to Their Majesties.

Our Baronial Heavy Weapons Champion has been confronted with some mundane obligations that currently limit his active participation, but we hope to see him back in form very soon. We wish him all the best.
