Potted Arms & Fancy Faire

Saturday, June 11, 2011 Hosted by the Canton of Hawkes Reache

Spring has flowered into summer once again and Baron Ateño of Annun Ridge and Baroness Lassar Ingen Aeda travel the lands of An Dubhaigeainn to collect their tithes on the way to the Pennsic War. The Canton of Hawkes Reache welcomes them with a Summer Faire complete with TWO fencing Tournaments including a Pas D'Arms Tournament to select the new Baronial fencing champion. There will also be a tournament to name the new Baronial Thrown Weapons Champion! There will be games and activities for all. (Additional martial activities to be announced.) Merchants are most welcome to help us get in fine shopping form for Pennsic! So bring your chairs and blankets to take respite upon the lawns, watch the fencing activities, and visit with old and new friends.

There will be a hearty day-board served throughout the day. While no feast will be served, fear not! None shall leave hungry, as the table has groaned under the bounty of our day-board these past four years! The fencing list shall open to competitors at 11 a.m.. There shall be two fencing Tournaments: the Hat Tournament and the Pas D'Arms Tournament.

Prior to the Hat Tournament, we will hold the ever-popular Hat Auction, benefiting the Baronial Rapier Community where the populace can bid for a fencer represented by their hat. If that rapier fighter wins the Tournament, the bidder wins a prize. The format of the Hat Tournament will be the decided by the day of the event.

The second Tournament is a Pas D'Arms contest which is based on a demonstration of period skill. Everyone is welcome to participate and there is a strong emphasis on pageantry. Each fencer in the Pas D'Arms Tournament must be introduced by a herald. It is expected that each herald will be vividly "over the top" (as in *A Knight's Tale*). A prize and recognition will be awarded for the best heraldry.

The demonstrations of both skill and pageantry will help Their Excellencies to choose the next Baronial Champion from the An Dubhaigeainn participants, and the overall Tournament Champion from all participants.

There will be two additional fund raising auctions: one to raise money for the Barony and a second to support the charities of the late Eric Johnson. (Wulstan of Ravenswood)

Seen on the Web

Google has just launched a new web function that not only allows you to tour some of the world's greatest museums, but also includes super detailed HD photos of some of their major artworks. The zoom function is really fabulous and lets you get really good close-ups of the detail work - great for A&S research. You can check it out here: http://www.googleartproject.com

This month, our focus is on the Wars of the Roses - a battle for the English throne that raged over thirty years between the houses of Lancaster and York in the 15th century. Two different branches of the Plantagenet dynasty, the house of Lancaster was represented by a red rose while the house of York used a white rose as its symbol. The wars were marked by several bloody battles, none bloodier than the Battle of Towton which won the throne for the Yorkist contender, Edward, Earl of March, crowned Edward IV.

Video of the Month

Pivotal in the War of the Roses, the Battle of Towton took place in northern Yorkshire during a driving snowstorm on Palm Sunday, 1461. By some accounts, the most bloody battle ever fought on English soil, chroniclers at the time estimated casualties of 28,000 for that single day's fighting. In 1996, workmen discovered a mass grave near Towton Hall that contained the remains of 43 individuals ranging in age from 16 to 50. The bodies had been stripped before burial, and all of them displayed evidence of horrific battle wounds, most involving head injuries. This four part video is an exploration of the forensic investigation by archaeologists from the University of Bradford and members of the West Yorkshire Archaeology Service. Think of it as CSI meets the Middle Ages.

In November of 2010, two men made what might be the most interesting discovery at the battle site of Towton when they found what is believed to be some of the earliest evidence of battlefield handguns. Simon Richardson has been searching the Towton battlefield with his metal detector for over sixteen years. Significantly, he has been plotting his finds and sharing his results with the archaeologists so that they can try to reconstruct the all day battle, following the ebb and flow of troop movements. On this occasion, he and archaeologist Tim Sutherland found fragments of what turned out to be cast metal guns. The find is significant since it was previously thought that early hand guns were used primarily as supportive siege weapons, not in battlefield maneuvers. Quoting from the BBC website, Sutherland said, "In terms of rarity, we don't know of any other battlefield where these have turned up. In terms of the medieval period the find is – as far as I know – unique; and in terms of Towton battlefield, it is very, very important because we are looking at the cusp of the use of archery and the introduction of handguns. It is incredibly important. We still cannot believe we have actually found these." Thank-you's for Hauppauge Middle School Demo

A big thank you to those members who participated in this year's Medieval Day at Hauppauge Middle School. Not only is this a great way to bring the Middle Ages alive for eleven and twelve year olds, but it is a wonderful opportunity for our Barony to give back to the community and showcase our skills.

This year's volunteers included Lady Sorcha who taught about the medieval kitchen garden, even going so far as to demonstrate for the kids how salves and infusions were prepared during the Middle Ages. Baroness Mistress Suzanne Nueber de Londres taught medieval dances to mixed classes of boys and girls. (If you think getting an eleven year old boy to dance with an eleven year old girl is easy, think again!) Baron Ateno talked about medieval guilds while Lady Alissenda helped children learn about medieval heraldry and create their own coat of arms. Lord Miquel tackled Medieval Myth Busting, teaching the kids the importance of critical research, and Lord Marcus had what was arguably the most fun job demonstrating medieval siege engines for the kids. Local Museum Exhibits

We're lucky enough to live close to a number of world class museums and galleries. Remember that many museums have hours for reduced admission - check before you go. You might also be able to obtain discounted admission tickets from your local librarian, or do a quick search on the Suffolk Web: http://suffolk.lib.ny.us/ Enter 'museum passes' in the search field to find out if your library offers passes. Here's a partial list of some current exhibits of interest:

The Museum of Biblical Art is currently hosting an exhibit entitled, *Uneasy Communion: Jews, Christians, and the Altarpieces of Medieval Spain.* Curated by Dr. Vivian B. Mann, Director of the Masters Program in Jewish Art at the Graduate School of the Jewish Theological Seminary, *Uneasy Communion* explores a rare instance of artistic collaboration between Christians and Jews in Spain during the Middle Ages. The Museum is located near Lincoln Center at 1865 Broadway at 61st Street, and the exhibit runs to May 30th. Suggested admission is seven dollars.

The Cloisters is hosting two upcoming talks with curators, a wonderful opportunity to meet and question professionals in the field. On May 6 you can talk with Dirk H. Breiding (assistant curator, Department of Arms and Armor, MMA) and on June 3, Helen C. Evans (Mary and Michael Jaharis Curator of Byzantine Art, Department of Medieval Art and The Cloisters, MMA). Both talks begin at 2 p.m. and are free with museum admission. They're only fifteen or twenty minutes long, but you can learn a good deal in that very short time! While you're there, be sure to check out the medieval gardens in bloom. Finally, there's a treat in store when we get back from Pennsic. On August 27 from 1-4 p.m. The Cloisters will host several weavers from the West Dean Tapestry Studio in Chichester England who will be demonstrating a number of tapestry weaving techniques from the early 16th century.


