Special East Kingdom Announcement regarding the Pikestaff

The SCA Board policy on kingdom electronic newsletters (e-newsletters) is scheduled to take effect on January 1, 2012, with the first e-newsletter available being the March, 2012 issue. Here are some of the important details of this policy:

- All paid Sustaining and International members will have access to all SCA, Inc. kingdom e-newsletters via a password-protected website, even if they choose to continue receiving paper newsletters.
- All kingdom newsletters will be 8.5"x11" with a uniform page count to allow all the paper newsletters to be sent in one bulk mailing.
- Within each kingdom, the paper and electronic newsletters will contain the same information, but the kingdom will have the option of including a supplemental PDF of articles, photo essays, art, etc. for the newsletters website.
- Once the link to the e-newsletter website is available on www.sca.org (after January 1, 2012), you may discontinue your paper newsletter, no matter where you are in your membership cycle. However, please be aware that no refunds can be issued if you choose to do so.
- An e-newsletter will not constitute proof of membership. For further info you can check <u>www.sca.org</u> or write to <u>comments@sca.org</u> and we will try to answer any question you may have.

Long Island Estonian House is located 65 miles east of NYC in Middle Island, New York, north of Route 25.

From the West: Take the Long Island Expwy. to Exit 64 north (NY-112 towards Port Jefferson). Drive for 3.2 miles, then turn right onto Middle Country Rd. (Rt. 25) for .03 miles and jog left onto Mt. Sinai Coram Rd. for 2.2 miles. Turn right onto Whiskey Rd. for 1 mile. Then turn right onto Middle Island Blvd. The entrance to Estonian House will be on your right.

From the East: Take the Long Island Expwy. to Exit 68 north (William Floyd Pkwy. CR 46) to Middle Country Rd. Rt. 25. Make a left and travel on Rt. 25 for 4.7 miles. There are many blogs on the internet that deal with subjects dear to the hearts of Scadians. This month, we'll be featuring a few that deal in detail with several arts and sciences. First up is <u>Eldrimner</u>, a blog about medieval and Viking Age food written by Daniel Serra, a PhD student in archaeology. Daniel posts frequently and almost always includes quotations from his period source material along with photos and recipes of his modern recreations. Some recent recreations include 'Heathen Peas' and 14th century pancakes.

Another fabulous blog for those interested in medieval embroidery is <u>Racaire's Embroidery & Needlework.</u> Racaire is a Scadian living in the Kingdom of Drachenwald. The blog features several of her interests including illumination, costuming and, of course, embroidery. Again, the blog is wonderfully informative with lots of pictures, how-to's and documentation of sources. For a treat, check out her completely embroidered 'Wallhanging Project" which has its own step by step progress blog. She also has some neat handouts for the Klosterstitch and Bayeux stitch.

Finally, if you're interested in pewter work, Her Ladyship, the Honorable Maîtresse Sabine du Bourbonnais from the Kingdom of Lochac has posted a wonderful step by step blog of her research and recreation of a <u>Heraldic Plaque Belt 14th-15th Century</u>. Her page is filled with photos of period examples as well as photos of the design and creation of her own heraldic plaque belt.

Video of the Month

OK, you've made it through both the earthquake and the hurricane, so it's time for a laugh. If you haven't seen it yet, this video is an entertaining imagining of a medieval help desk - tech support for the challenged, as media changed from scrolls to bound books. http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=pQHX-SjgQvQ

On the scientific front, new discoveries have been made regarding both the Black Death and the cold fermentation process used to produce Bavarian lager beers. A recent article in the New York Times describes how scientists are attempting to isolate the differences between the microbe that causes modern bubonic plague today and the scourge that wiped out a great swath of Europe beginning in 1348. In Germany, scientists think they have cracked the great mystery of the hybrid yeast responsible for the cold fermentation process used in Bavarian lager beers. In the 15th century a mystery yeast was combined with traditional European yeasts to make cold fermentation possible. Scientists now believe it was a New World import. Local Museum Exhibits and Events

We're lucky enough to live close to a number of world class museums and galleries. Remember that many museums have passes for reduced admission - check before you go. You might also be able to obtain discounted admission passes from your local librarian, or do a quick search on the Suffolk Web: http://suffolk.lib.ny.us/. Enter 'museum passes' in the search field to find out if your library offers passes. Here's a partial list of some current exhibits and activities of interest:

The Morgan Library and Museum on Madison Ave. and 36th St. is currently hosting *Illuminating Fashion: Dress in the Art of Medieval France and the Netherlands* through September 4. http://www.themorgan.org/exhibitions/exhibition.asp?id=45. Guided tours of the exhibit are offered Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at 2:00 p.m. For more information, please call (212) 685-0008, ext. 561. Bear in mind that the museum commentary on the illuminations is written by art historians, not medieval historians who often take exception to some of the historical conclusions drawn by the commentary. As ever, check out several different sources when researching any history - you might be surprised at the academic controversies! Starting next month, the Morgan will feature *Treasures of Islamic Manuscript Painting*, beginning on October 21 and running through January 29, 2012. Along with a rare opportunity to see several of the works unbound, the Morgan is also hosting a number of related programs to illuminate the exhibit. On Friday, **October 28 at 7:00 p.m.**, the museum will screen a film on the Sufi poet, Rumi. For a full listing of the related programs, please see the museum website: http://www.themorgan.org/exhibitions/exhibition.asp?id=50.

Remember, admission to the Morgan is FREE on Friday evenings from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art at Fifth Avenue and 82nd Street is always a delightful place to view historic art and sculpture. The museum has several current exhibits that might be of interest to the membership. Recently opened, Historic Images of the Greek Bronze Age focuses on the artwork discovered at the excavations of Troy and Knossos in the 19th century, while Thinking Outside the Box features European cabinets, caskets, and cases from the 1500s to the 1900s. Up at **The Cloisters** at 190th Street in Fort Tryon Park, garden tours and museum highlight tours are given regularly. If you are interested in learning more about the cultivation and uses of a medieval garden, why not check out their blog, *The Medieval Garden Enclosed?* http://blog.metmuseum.org/cloistersgardens/ For more information on their programs, you can check out the museum's web site here: http://www.metmuseum.org/cloisters/ And remember, the **Medieval Festival at Fort Tryon Park** will be held there on **Sunday, October 2** from 11:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Free to the public, the Festival is a medieval themed street fair with performers, merchants and demonstrations.

Located on Audubon Terrace, Broadway between 155th and 156th Streets, The Hispanic Society of America is a free museum that houses seminal works for the study of the arts and cultures of Spain, Portugal, and Latin America. Closed on Mondays, The Hispanic Society offers free 45-minute tours of the building and collections given by Museum Curators or the Education Department at 2:00 p.m. on Saturdays. The collection includes decorative arts, painting, sculpture and textiles.

For those interested in the culture and art of India, don't miss the current exhibit at **The Brooklyn Museum**, *Vishnu: Hinduism's Blue-Skinned Savior*, running through October 2, 2011. Presenting approximately 170 paintings, sculptures, and ritual objects that were made in India between the fourth and twentieth centuries, this exhibit focuses on Vishnu, one of Hinduism's three major deities. The museum is located at 200 Eastern Parkway in Brooklyn. For more information, see their website: http://www.brooklynmuseum.org/
