First Century Iron Age Helmet Found

Recently, a rare find was made by an anonymous metal detector enthusiast" on a farm near Canterbury. It was an Iron Age helmet that dates back to the first century and according to experts, may originate from the beginning of Roman times in Britain. Knowing that this must be an important discovery the finder of the helmet contacted a team of archaeologists. Later, a brooch from the same period was also unearthed.

What made this find particularly interesting was that bone fragments were found in the helmet which indicates that the helmet was used to hold a cremated soldier before burial. Experts also claim that the accompanied brooch may have been used to fasten the bag that carried the helmet and remains. Although several other Iron Age helmets have been found, none have included any sign of a cremated soldier within.

Arts and Sciences Championship!!!

Although the date is not yet official, our Baronial Arts and Sciences Schola and Championship is only a few months away. Since it is normally held in late winter/early spring, our current Champion, Rue, has so graciously decided to post the rules for this year's competition early to give participants an adequate amount of time to complete their projects.

This year, each participant is required to create **three** different pieces, each representing a different A&S medium (sewing, painting, calligraphy, music, woodworking, etc.)

In addition, the three pieces must have a common theme. For example, one could embroider a rose for one piece, create an illumination including roses, and write a rose-inspired period-style song. Another example would be to carve a wooden bowl with a fish design, then have fish similarly decorate a leather pouch, along with a serving of fish.

This Championship will test participants' skills among the variety of arts as well as the creativity to create a unifying artistic theme. It should be noted that the interpretation of the theme's occurrence in the three separate pieces is up to the artisan. Documentation requirements are minimal: list the Medium, Theme, and Period-style of each piece, with a small paragraph describing the techniques used.




Greetings to the Populace of An Dubhaigeainn
