- -Take Route 110 North past Jericho Turnpike (Route 25) to Main Street (Route 25A) in Huntington Village (approx. 4 miles north of Route 25).
- -Turn left onto Main Street and then make the first right turn onto Wall Street. Continue north on Wall Street for approx. 3/4 mile to Southdown Road.
- -Turn left onto Southdown Road and continue west for approx. 1 mile to Browns Road.
- -Turn right onto Browns Road (stop sign and blinking light at intersection.) Continue north to the site (109 Browns Road), which is on the left just past Southdown School.

A&S Championship Rules and Requirements

This year, each participant is required to create **three** different pieces, each representing a different A&S medium (sewing, painting, calligraphy, music, woodworking, etc.)

In addition, the three pieces must have a common theme. For example, one could embroider a rose for one piece, create an illumination including roses, and write a rose-inspired period-style song. Another example would be to carve a wooden bowl with a fish design, then have fish similarly decorate a leather pouch, along with a serving of fish.

This Championship will test participants' skills among the variety of arts as well as the creativity to create a unifying artistic theme. It should be noted that the interpretation of the theme's occurrence in the three separate pieces is up to the artisan. Documentation is required!!!

Bardic Competition Rules and Requirements

- 1. PURPOSE OF THE COMPETITION
 - 1. To choose a performing arts Champion for the Barony of An Dubhaigeainn.
 - 2. The performing arts include: Vocal and instrumental music, story telling, poetry, drama, dance and physical arts (jugglers, acrobats, jesters, magicians etc.)

2. ELIGIBILITY

1. Entrants must be paid members of the SCA, Inc. and members of the Barony.

3. DUTIES OF THE BARONIAL BARDIC CHAMPION

- To swear an oath of fealty or service to the Coronets.
- 2. To defend the honor and prestige of the Barony whenever such is challenged.
- To further the interests of their area of endeavor.
- 4. To attend the next Baronial Bardic Championship, to choose their successor.

4. BASIC CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

- 1. Number of pieces:
 - The entrant will be required to present two entries in the initial judging.
 - 2. The time taken to judge the entry will be broken into: oral presentation, performance, questions, time for the judges to consult, and time for judges to prepare for the next participant.
- 2. 'Periodicity' requirement: All entries must either be documentable as period OR have a period/traditional feel, sound, or ambience.
- 3. Category requirement: The entrant may choose any two entries they wish, however, the entries must be TWO separate performing arts (see above) and more credit will be given to a document-able piece.

4. Group entries:

- 1. Group entries will be permitted, however the entrant's contribution to the piece must be easily distinguishable from that of the other members of the group.
- 2. If the entrant's contribution is not easily distinguishable (i.e. to determine the abilities of one singer in a madrigal group), then the entrant must also perform at least a portion of their 'part' as a solo. This can happen either before, after or during the group performance.

Keep Calm And Carry Rattan

One of History's Most Famous Kings Finally Has a Face!!!

Last September what is believed to be the remains of King Richard III was found under a car park during an archaeological dig in Leicester. DNA from the remains was matched to his two living descendants and as a result led to a lot more research on the skeleton. Further proof lies in the description of the body's bone structure. The skull shows distinct proof of head wounds, which matches the account that King Richard was killed by a blow to the head in the Battle of Bosworth at the age of thirty two. In addition, the skeleton has scoliosis which matches the "hunchback" description of the King.

Even more exhilarating, is that experts were able to reconstruct the King's facial features using CT scans at the University of Leicester. Enthusiasts are extremely excited since it is now proven that King Richard was very handsome with his prominent cheek bones and chin.

Since all surviving portraits of him were based on earlier paintings, we really did not have an accurate likeness of him until now making this one of the most important finds in some time.
