#### **Potted Arms**

On the 17th of June the next Baronial Fencing Champion for the Barony of An Dubhaigeainn will be chosen. All fencers near and far are asked to come to the Canton of Hawkes Reache and show their worth. While only a Duck can win the Baronial Fencing Champion title, there will be prizes for the tournaments. Our current Champion Laird Eanraig has devised unique tournaments to test all fencers and delight the assembled crowd. The fencing will have crowd participation! While there is no feast, this event will have a hearty dayboard as is the norm in the Canton and Barony. There I space for heavy weapons, if a marshal is present.

From Laird Eanraig, the current Baronial Champion of Fencing:

In wishing to encourage more participation and breadth of spectacle into this year's contest, I have come up with a challenge that will hopefully make for some epic moments and great memories.

This years championship fight will be open to all fencers, with the top seeded baronial member being crowned the new Fencing Champion of An Dubhaigeainn. The hat tourney format will be a round robin, best 2 passes out of 3, standard rules will apply, and don't forget your Herald who will announce your presence to all. Of course, there is a special twist: each fencer CAN choose a coach from the populace assembled (even other fencers), and the coach is allowed to shout encouragement and tips to help during the fight. Coaches will decide the weapons chosen for each round (both fencers will use the same exact combo of weapons, including blade length). If a fencer chooses to not have a coach or cannot find one, the opponent's coach decides for both. If there is a tie for the top spot, the Coronet will choose the weapon combo used, best 2 out of 3 passes, and they will be the coaches should they choose to do so.

Requiem Tournament: The baronial champions tourney will be a unique challenge for all who enter. You will be requested to play a measure of music (preferably a melodic minor) on my violin to decide your fate in the tourney (time limit 30 seconds). You will be judged by the Coronet and myself. Play any funeral dirge well, and you get your choice of positions and weapons forms. Play poorly, you get what the Baron and Baroness allow – choices will be 2 forms in which the fencer has qualifications, and where in the line you will march. Play nothing, you get El Repugnato or his ugly cousin and you are first in line. Comportment and proper behavior is of utmost importance, as this is a funeral march. Format will be a bear pit, wounds retained, winner can stay in the Pit for 3 passes maximum. If you die in the Pit, you MUST use another weapons form for you next pass, if able. Each fencer is allowed 9 lives to start, more or less depending upon turnout. Points are awarded as follows: wounds are 1 point, kill is 2 points, max points awarded is 3. Double kills are double kills, no repeats (both fencers get 2 pts). And lets hope there are a goodly number of Bards and Troubadours willing to sing your demise upon your exit, should you die.

Prizes will be awarded for the top spot in both tourneys, and the best Herald will share in the spoils for the Hat Tourney. Should there be a tie for the Requiem tourney, it will be decided by a single pass, single sword duel to the last person surviving.

More details will be posted on the Canton, Baronial and Kingdom websites, and on Facebook.

The site opens at 10am. The list opens at 11am, with the tournaments starting High Noon. The site closes at 5pm, as we have to be off site by 6pm. (All times are REAL WORLD.)

### Growing Your Newcomers – How to Welcome (and Keep) Newcomers in Your Group Baronessa Gianetta Lucia Alegretta, called Sidda

How many of you remember your first event?

How many of you remember the exact moment you decided to stay with the S.C.A.? Or, even identified with a specific group in the S.C.A?

What sticks out in your minds with any of these moments? Was it a person or was it an action they took that made the impact?

I'll lay you odds, it all starts with someone including you and/or making you feel welcome in some way.

We, here in An Dubhaigeainn, are blessed to be a part of one of the most welcoming groups around. We have folks who travel from near and far to come and play with us. We have a reputation for welcoming folks with open arms. This makes for wonderful memories for many folk. That being said, for every great memory or experience, there are some not-so-great ones.

Everyone comes to the S.C.A. seeking different things and everyone has both good and bad days. Nobody is perfect, but it's important to remember that and to keep in mind how you respond to newcomers who are, more than likely, unfamiliar with our group history or personal dynamics. Courtesy and chivalry, plus a desire to help others, are major parts of what makes the Society such a great place to be. No one says you need to be the Chatelaine – lord knows you don't *need* to talk to each and every person you meet <chuckle> - but, we are all of us unofficial "chatelaines." Not everyone feels comfortable dealing with the public, not everyone has the time, and not everyone has the patience. And, that's fine – we are, after all, a volunteer organization.

But, remember how much courage it took for you just to approach that first person, hoping you didn't sound like a complete idiot? Well, as the Society has aged as a group, as more historical research becomes available to us, and we ourselves have become more experienced (and sometimes, more jaded), this has, in some cases, widened that gap for newcomers, making it a more daunting prospect. Just think what it would have been like for you back then, if that amazing person or persons who "lit your fire." So to speak, had responded rather crankily with "What?!" instead of a smiling "Hi" or "You look a little lost, how can I help you?" Think about it. Would you have given the Society, or the group, another chance? Or would you have simply walked away, never to return.

If you're having an "off" day (and everyone has them), it's a simple thing to direct that newcomer to someone who's having a *not*-so-off day. Just take a breath and let that newcomer know, "Hey, I'm sorry I can't help you right now, but, you see that person over there, the one in the green tunic? That's Lord or Lady Greenfield. They can help you. Just tell them I sent you over." If you feel up to it, you can even walk the newcomer over and introduce them to smooth over any awkwardness they might feel. Then, you can simply go your own way knowing you've done what you can for them. No damage has been done to either party and everyone walks away feeling good.

I ask that you be aware of that person standing next to you at the next event, anywhere. That person, maybe not in the greatest garb, maybe with a bemused or glazed expression on his or her face – that was *you* once upon a

time. Take a moment, a few sentences is all it takes really, to explain what's going on and make them feel welcome. *That's all.* Then, the next person gives a few sentences or a little help, and so forth. If everyone gives that person a tiny bit of their time, that newcomer goes home feeling great and – that newcomer comes back because of the good they experienced.

Another thing to remember is that everyone has a background; everyone has baggage from that background. We all filter our current experiences through what we've experienced in the past.

Some of us can relate to the "We know you can do better" scenario growing up, right? The translation we took to heart was "Wow, I guess I'm not being or doing good enough." *It's words <u>said versus words heard versus words "translated/filtered."</u> It's great when we help folks look better in their garb but, keep in mind how your advice (and your <i>tone*) may be *perceived*. To the newcomer you saw at yesterday's event in the bright pink and obviously polyester dress, you might have said – "Wow, what a great job! You really should use linen, though." The translation and reception to that piece of advice *may not* be as great as you might have thought. For instance, this could have translated to "I guess I can't wear this since it's not really good enough to participate in this group." You'd be surprised just how many times this translation comes up. And, sometimes, the newcomer doesn't come back. Remember, it took a *lot* for them to create that dress or tunic; it took a *lot* for them to wear it amongst complete and total strangers that they were hoping to fit in with.

Consider, instead: "Wow, you did a great job! Did you make that yourself?" Newcomer: "Yes, I did." You: "I have some spare linen. If you like, you can have some to make another dress so you have another piece of garb to wear so you don't have to worry about getting your fancy/court dress dirty..." or "If you want, I can show you some embroidery stitches to you can decorate your dress." (These are just a couple of examples.) Now, you've given them a compliment, making them feel great about their work, AND you've put out your hand to help, making them feel a part of something. *Doesn't that feel good?* 

Offers like these go a long way towards making a newcomer feel welcome in your group. No one says you need to give things away, but offers of help, in *any* form – offering assistance, teaching something new, offering a ride to an event – these things are always welcome. Just think, you could be "*that person*" – the one some newcomer someday remembers fondly as the reason he or she *stayed* in the S.C.A. And, the circle is complete.

If everyone offers a little bit of themselves here and there, if everyone sets the example of what good things the Society represents, the next generation – *our newcomers* – will incorporate those bits into their SCA experience, standing that much taller and shining that much brighter in the Society's garden, enriching it that much more, both locally and abroad.

Go forth and – Be "that person"!
