The History of An Dubhaigeainn

Installment 4

JANUARY 1989 – On going fighting and music practices. Our February Tavernevent was cancelled. At Kingdom 12th Night in Lions End on the 21st, Maryette Rianna Cantrell was given an Award of Arms, and Cantillation and Pandemonium both performed to the pleasure of those assembled.

March 1989 – Regular monthly shared fight/dance practices with Lions End underway. Commons was held at Diana and Philip's on the 18th and featured Middle-eastern food stuff and a lion subtlety by Miranda. Leif attended the Southern Regional meeting on the 25th.

CHRONICLER: Sine Faur-Ortange

APRIL 1989 – On the first, appropriately, Ostgardr held its 10th Anniversary of Celtic Silliness. Cantillation sand at the C.W. Post Ren Faire in Lions End on the 23rd. April Commons was held at Leif's on the 29th, and featured "illusions foods" (in the medieval world, April Fool's Day featured everything upside down – people told storied about foolish peasants with wise donkeys, wore their clothes inside-out or backwards – and illusion foods that looked unexpectedly different from how they tasted were always popular.) There was also a lesson in Ukrainian Egg Decorating, taught by Rosamonde (for her article on how-to see VIADUCT Vol 4 No,11)

AS XXIII - in the reign of TRM Morguhn and Maurya

MAY 1989 - Fighting and music practices, and armoring and garb workshops on the calendar.

JUNE 1989 – On the 10th, our gentles gave a demo at the Islip Americana Fair, at which Geoffrey Chamberlain qualified in sword and Shield. On the 24th, John of Graves End held Commons. Timmus jouned us from Settmour Swamp.

July 1989 – Four Intrepid Ducks (Vanemonde, Gliobach, Gynyr and Sine) went up to Sterlying Vayle for Return of the Wife of Bath event on the 14th-15th; the site was rustic and private, and included a chilly swimming hole with sun-warmed rocks to bask on. In the evenings folk gather around the fire to sing until the wee hours. (Great fun, if not overly Chaucerian!) At Pre-pennsic Commons on the 22nd at Leif's, painted wooden ducks (including a "bull" with horns" were made for our cattle pen, and several folk began making heraldic banners under Rosamonde's encouragement. Gunther and Gwenlynn frequently had an over-full house, what with all the Visby Coat and garb making going on. Cynyr qualified in great sword at a joint fighter practice in Lions End.

AUGUST 1989 – Pennsic War XVIII: The East Kingdom lost the Bridges but won the War? A record 6870 gentles had arrived by Sunday, 14 of them our own, several Shire folk camped with Lions End, and the rest were with the Kilkenny household by the showers! Richard the Tudor had the pleasure of being hand-fasted to his lady, Isabell of York from Ostgardr, and also killing 13 Mid-realm warriors. Leif, unfortunately was killed by and east realmer during the Field Battle, and fell to the ground crying "Blue! Blue! Aaugh!" Rob, however, survived to the conclusion of the battle, our cattle raiders (primarily Katie, Sinead Josie, Muirdeach and Rob) were quite successful at the "finding" of livestock, little of it actually bovine. Some of our gentles sang with the Knowne World Chorus. The weather, for a War, was quite reasonable, perhaps due to our finding of a relic coincidental, oddly enough, with the acquisition of a duck-shaped "reliquary" to top our standard pole). One faction held that this relic, a cooked duck bone, is that of a Sacred Duck, while others of us, in more moderate fashion, believe it to be a remnant of a meal eaten by St. Andrew. Some of us joined Kilkenny's Sunday night "decompression" party; this year's theme was "Rambeau! Best used of ammunition as accessory" inspired by Katie of Carrigart's use of arrows as hair ornaments. The singers, especially our neighbors Lord Morgan of Caer Graeme and Lord Don, were all wonderful-sharing songs to shiver from, or to bellow along with. < photos by Gliobach, Leif, Vanemonde, Rosamonde)

The History of An Dubhaigeainn

SEPTEMBER 1989 - Compilation of this History was begun by Gliobach in this month. On September 16, a Day of Dance was held; Pandemonium, with the addition of Henri Michel du Bois and visiting violinist Giathrey, provided live 1nusic, while Leif autocrated, Sine trolled, and Gunther and Gwenlynn ran the kitchen. Diana acted as Dance Mistress, with some help from both Richard the Poor and Phelan ap Emrys. The backgammon tournament was won by Gunther, who was awarded the prize, made by Lorenzo, of a painted chamois backgammon board/pouch with tigereye- and citrine-nugget men. As folk could not immediately resume dancing after feasting so heartily, sometime was pleasantly passed with conversation and the reintroduction of the giving of Cloven Fruit into Shire custom. A Post-Revel was held at Leif's, where we regaled one another with filk songs, Mistress Aravis recounted memories of earlier days in the Kingdom, and John of Graves End gave a delightfully reverent reading of "The Book of Letters," (TI No. 92). At Puntathlon V in Dragonship Haven on the 23rd, our own Lorenzo-after missing last year's-again made it to the quarterfinals, this time against a grueling 5-second time limit.

OCTOBER 1989 – The big topic of discussion at the business meeting was "going Barony". On the 7th, about 14 Shire folk attended Commons, where there were interesting board games, and lovely embroidery being done by Gwenlynn, Theresa, Mairgret and Katie. TImmus contributed some marvelous meat pies for dinner, and Theresa brought cheesecake. Under Rosamonde's instructions, we also made soft pretzels and hot cross buns for the "small period breads" workshop. Everyone tried their hand at creative pretzel sculpture, which included a duck, Celtic-style knots and treble clefts, as well as the traditional pretzel shape; and of course, we promptly ate them. On the 14th and 15th, we participated in the first Renaissance Fair at SUNY Stoney Brook, in cooperation with Stoney Brook Medieval Guild, which is made up of SUNY Students. The SCA turnout was good, and the comments of all were favorable; our people put on a rattan demo, a display of arts and an information booth, singing by Cantillation and dance to the music of Pandemonium. Surprisingly, many visitors not only allowed themselves to be drafted into dance but also stayed for one more set.

AS XXIV - In the reign of TRM Horic and Lea

NOVEMBER 1989 – Richard the Poor, now of Northpass, kindly sent down several copies of a useful pattern book. On the 2nd, the Herald's many coronets met at the house of Timmus ibn Alron Haddan. Many Shire folk attended Agincourt/Curia Regis on the 4th in Ostgardr. Leif held his second annual Leaf Harvest on the 5th, again providing good fare as bribe for those wielding rakes, After Commons on the 18th there was the Feast of St Andrew on the 25th, when through the snows cane a handful of folk, who were given good food in plenty but Gunther and Gwenlynn, and very nice desserts from the talented wags of Lions End. A few hardy souls armored up and went outside, but the majority preferred to remain warm and game (Vanemonde won the backgammon prize of a chamois game board/pouch, mad by Timmon) or learn new dances with Phelan (this might have been the day that earned him the title of Sadistic Dance Master from Hell – you humble historian danced Strip a Willow three times and was tottering like an ancient the next morning)
