On a clear, chilly day in late Autumn, Prefect Titus Aurelius Magnus, and Baroness Sorcha of Stonegrave Welcomed all and sundry to our annual competitions finding the Baronial Champions of Archery, Thrown Weapons, and Brewing. The cozy location at the Estonia House in Middle Island, New York was homey and warm inside, while brisk and sunny on the ranges. An excellent dayboard of yummy dishes, prepared by Mistress Jadwiga Zajaczkowa and her staff, was well enjoyed by all.

After the competitions completed, the populace gathered in the comfortable hall for the Baronial Court as follows, thus as recalled by Your Humble Drake Herald.

The past year's Thrown Weapons Champion m'lord Michael Leg-Bane was compelled from his place behind the Seats, and asked to elaborate on the tourneys which he oversaw this day.

First m'lord Michael went over the Youth Tournament, conceived by last year's Champion, young Lord Tiberius Trebellius Severus. Contestants received points based on how many playing cards affixed to the target were Hit. The winning Youth Thrower was young Griffon of House Three Skulls. He was heartily congratulated and advised that he must come up with the contest for next year. His Prize was a new set of throwing knives. A scroll was presented to young Griffon, with words by Lady Sláine báen Ronán, Calligraphy by Lady Fionnghuala the Volatile, and Illumination by fellow Youth (on her 1st Scroll) Lady Caoilfhionn inghean Ceallachain. The scroll was met with many ooo's and aaah's from the Gallery, and received excitedly by the recipient. Lord Tiberius was gifted with the Traditional Small Glass Duck Pendant of the Newly Retired Champion, and both youths returned to their place in the Gallery.

Then was the Adult Thrown Weapons Champion announced. The Adult's Tourney was also playing card based, but the weapons needed to Cut the cards, and Stick in the Target. Our own beloved Seneschal, Lord Fearghus MacCailin, achieved the high score. His prize was a Bearded Axe, his scroll had words by Lady Sláine báen Ronán with Calligraphy and Illumination by Lady Fionnghuala the Volatile. As Lord Fearghus took his place of Honor alongside the other Champions, m'lord Michael, having passed along the Champion's Regalia, accepted his Small Glass Duck Pendant, and prepared to step down.

But first he asked m'lady Rosalie Jane Blackmore to be called into the Baronial Presence. Since Atl-atl is newly authorized in the Knowne World, and does not yet have official scoring guidelines, we could not hold an official Championship Tournament. However, m'lady Rosalie had the best accuracy and distance in the challenges available today, and deserved Mention and a Prize. She was presented with an Atl-atl caster made by m'lord Michael Leg-bane with the intent to foster Atl-atl throughout the Knowne World in general, and in Our Ducky lands in particular.

There being another martial award to deliver, this years' Archery Champion, m'lord Tomasso Parlapiano, was summoned from his place beside the Baronial Seats to discuss the Archery Championship held this day. There were many contenders for this illustrious title, but it was handily won by Laird Eanraig the Bonesetter. There was conversation about how this was the eighth occasion on which Laird Eanraig had knelt in the Presence of the Coronet to receive Champion's Regalia, a fact causing much amusement among the Dais and Gallery alike. As the Baroness & Prefect helped m'lord Tomasso Divest himself of his Archery Hood, whose tail had become entangled with various items at the back of m'lord Tomasso's belt, the Archery Champion Scroll was read; Words, Calligraphy, and Illumination all by Lady Oda Lally (in her 1st scroll). This too was received with many the ooo and ahhh from the Gallery. Laird Eanraig took his place among the Champions, and m'lord Tomasso was given his Small Glass Duck pendant, but was not allowed to leave the Presence just yet.

Arrows, Axes, and Ales: Laudi Romani Unofficial Court Report:

Kneeling before their Excellencies, Lord Tomasso was bestowed with an Award of Arms in the Names of King Ozurr the Boot-Giver and Queen Fortune Sancte Keyne which was meant to be presented at Southern Region War camp in June, but was able to be received from the hands of Our Gracious Excellencies this day. His Royal Scroll was Written by Theodora Bryennissa (called Trennah) with Calligraphy and Illumination by Wulfgar Silfrahárr.

Having finished with the Arrows and Axes, we now moved on to the Ales. Lady Fionnghuala the Volatile stepped out from her place at the Coronets' side, and told of the hotly contested Championship, which had but one entrant. The Chocolate Hazelnut Mead, based on a Period Recipe, was deemed Very Tasty, was Beautiful in Color and Clarity so therefore Lord Akos Zekel was declared Champion. His scroll had words by Lady Sláine báen Ronán, with Calligraphy by Lady Violet Hughes, and Illumination by Lady Fionnghuala the Volatile. He was gifted with a bottle of Lady Fionnghuala's own Ciser as a prize, and took his place at her side among the Champions, for Lady Fionnghuala is also the A&S Champion. This good lady still received her Small Glass Duck Pendant, for though she remained standing, she had officially stepped down.

The individual awards being completed, Their Excellencies now wanted to start honoring folk by the group. M'lord Robert d'Whitmont, Lady Michele the Ubiquitous and Mistress Jadwiga Zajaczkowa, and Hrothgar of an Dubhaigeainn were called into the Presence to have Silver Feathers bestowed upon them for their Exceptional Service to the Barony.

Lady Michele was also Awarded a Maunche, an Order of High Merit given for arts and sciences, either for excellence in one specific area or for surpassing competence in several. She received it for her work in the Fiber Arts.

Lady Monkey Makgee was then called in to receive her Burdened Tyger Award for her FABulous Dayboard at Ozurr & Fortune's Coronation. This good gentle had been in Europe when it was bestowed, at our previous event of St Andrew Crosses the Alps, so Their Excellencies gave it in the Name of the Crown this day.

Now the Gallery and Dais alike got to enjoy the Spectacle of Their Excellencies running this way and that to hand out Bronze Ducks to members of the Populace for noted service to the Barony. Some of these may have been reported before, but were actually given this day.

Member Highlight



Name: Maestra Gianetta Lucia Alegretta (also known as "Syd the Vicious") mka Laurie Boullianne

How did you learn about the SCA? I used to dress up and go to various Renn Faires. A friend of mine, Hilary, back in 1985, kept her horse at the stables next door to C.W. Post campus. The campus was holding its annual Renn Faire and Hilary and I decided to get dressed up (including her horse, which she had made caparisons for) and "crash" the Faire. We created such a stir that the Faire's campus coordinator ran to the SCA table asking them where they got the horse from – it was great! The local SCA members (pre-Lions End) said they thought we were one of the campus' folk. It was there that I met the couple who headed up the Household that I would eventually join, Von Morgenwind. It wasn't long before I began attending the local demos and events.

What about it attracted you? I love the history, the chivalry, and the sense of comradery that I couldn't seem to find outside the SCA. As an artist, I also love the creativity of the Society.

How long have you been a part of the SCA? I joined back in 1985 and was so hooked that I became involved in the formation of Lions End – my name is one of the ones on its charter.

What is your SCA persona? Gianetta Lucia Alegretta is the eldest child of an important merchant family in 15th Century Genoa. She has a good head for her family's business and a creative eye for

spotting the latest trends in fashion and household necessities, especially those items that would enrich her family's coffers. Recognizing such talents early on, her father saw to it that she received an intensive education far beyond many women of the time so that she could travel with him to the courts and assist him in his trade endeavors.

What activities do you participate in? Arts & Sciences (esp. costuming, embroidery, millinery, C&I are among some of the interests I pursue). Research (A&S, women's roles in history, historic sumptuary laws, etc.) Thrown Weapons (I am a Marshal) and Archery. Writing/ Teaching (teaching classes locally, out-of-area, and at Pennsic; writing teaching articles for The Viaduct) – I LOVE to teach! (as much as I love to take classes!)

What has been your favorite moment? At my first Pennsic as Coronet. I remember deciding before the Field Battle, when our Baronial forces were at their peak numbers, that I wanted to gather them and deliver a "pep talk." As I began to speak, telling them how proud I was of them and my hopes that they would return to me whole and victorious, I had one of those indescribably surreal "moments" where I realized that, if this were an actual war and these my warriors, many of them might not be returning home to me. I was so effected that I actually choked up and had to hold back tears as I spoke to my fighters. Later, after the battle was over, His Excellency Turk, a longtime friend of mine, approached and said to me, "Lady, do you realize, if this were real, we would have gladly died for you?" And here I had thought I was the only one who was caught in the moment! I still get the shivers when I think about that "moment."

What would say are your greatest accomplishments in the SCA thus far?

I was involved in the formation of two local groups - I was heavily involved in the formation of Lions End and my name is on their charter. I also helped in the formation of Whyt Whey, when I lived there for a little while. I served twice as Baronial Chatelaine and once as the Barony's Thrown Weapons Deputy. From there, Jean Xavier and I were approached to run for the Baronial Seat to become Heirs to the founding Baron and Baroness, Muirdeach and Mairgret of Carrigart. Jean Xavier and I served as Coronets for six years before stepping down. During our tenure, we sought to unite the Baronial populace, creating a bridge between old and new members, and to create a strong foundation of tradition within the Barony. Part of that tradition involved the creation of additional Baronial awards to encourage the populace to participate and be recognized for their efforts within the Barony. We also endeavored to make sure the populace was recognized outside of the Barony by encouraging folks to travel with us to out-of-area events and by advocating for them for Kingdom awards. I have an Award of Arms, from when I was a Lions Ender. Later, as a member of An Dughaigeainn, I received my first Silver Feather from Their then-Excellencies, Mairgret and Muirdeach. Later, I earned two more Baronial awards, becoming a Companion in the Order of the Silvanus Doke and then twice receiving a Bronze Duck. I was recognized for my seamstress work and other assistance for then-Queen Isabella I with a Queen's Honor of Distinction. While not formally recognized, I have also created court ensembles (or assisted on them) for a few Royals. My particular joy has been the creation of Peerage regalia "on the sly" for a small handful of folks I consider dear to me. I received a Court Barony for my tenure as a Landed Coronet. I am a member of the Orders of the Maunche and the Silver Crescent. I was recognized at Pennsic with the William Blackfox award for one of my articles on welcoming newcomers. I was Elevated this past St Andrews to the Order of the Pelican.

What future goals do you have in the SCA?

As my mantra is "Everyone is a Chatelaine," I fully intend to continue to encourage folks to be welcoming to Newcomers. I love talking to folks, especially in regards to helping Newcomers and new Chatelaines alike. I also intend to continue to encourage folks to remember that, while many of us are in this to learn and to teach, we do this for FUN, as well. Without the fun, it just becomes dry and stale and stagnant.
