Fighters of the Barony at Blackstone Raids



There we were!

On the cover, you will see those who represented the Barony at Blackstone Raids this past April. Front row (l-r) Lord Peter Bog, Master Ateno, and Lady Lassar. Back row (l-r) Lord Nicodemus, Baron Jean Xavier, and Ulric. Answering the call to arms by King Gaufred Kelson to aid our allies of AEthelmearc, this stalwart group piled into two vehicles after working all day and drove 630+ miles through the night into Saturday morning to Charleston, West Virginia, where the battles would take place. There, they joined the rest of the Eastern Army, which, in the end, numbered 68. This more than doubled the number of troops that our allies had fielded in the past, thus preventing the Mid Realm from dominating the battles. Our Baronial forces fought in three field battles, a bridge battle, and a castle battle. With fatigue setting in for most of the Baronial unit, we declined the final battle within the fabricated mine. Let it be known that His Majesty's hospitality has no bounds. For, after granting our Baronial forces leave, He then offered us the opportunity to freshen up before making the return trip home to An Dubhaigeainn. King Gaufred Kelson is truly a King of the people.

At the end of the battles, AEthelmearc split the battles with the Mid Realm. This is the first time that the Mid Realm did not totally overwhelm Aethelmearc during the battles. --- Jean Xavier

Sachem Public Library in Holbrook: From the west: LIE to exit 61. Go across Patchogue-Holbrook Rd. and stay on the service road. *At the first light past Patchogue-Holbrook make a left. This is Holbrook Road. The Library is about a 1/2mile down on the left, across from an elementary school. Go in and ask for the Boardroom. From the East: Take the LIE to exit 61. At the light for Patchogue-Holbrook Road make a left and go over the LIE. At the end of the bridge make a left onto the service road, follow from * above.

Connetquot Public Library in Bohemia From the West: Take Sunrise Highway (Rte 27) to Exit 47, Go to Ocean Avenue and make Left. From the East: Take Sunrise highway to Exit 49 (Lakeland Avenue). Go to Ocean Avenue and make a right. The Library in on the Left

Riverhead Free Library: The library is located at 330 Court Street, Riverhead. From the West: Take your best route to the Long Island Expressway east bound to Exit 72. Stay to your right following the signs to Route 25 east to Riverhead. Route 25 will become West Main Street. The Library will be visible from West Main Street. Turn left onto Osborn Avenue after you pass the library on West Main Street. Library parking can be found on your left before the railroad tracks. From the East: Take your best route to either Route 25 from the North Fork into Riverhead. Seneschal's Missive

Greetings,

By now we wrapped up another event, Follow the Gypsy Caravan. I'm sorry I couldn't make it but I had a meeting to attend I hope all went well. The next scheduled event hosted by us is Autumn revel, a day of danceand feasting, in September. Between now and then we have something everymonth, History in motion in June 12 & 13; a demo/commons at the Smithtown Historical Society's Brush Barn Facility, Hawks Reach is organizing a baronial commons in July, and August is always Pennsic. Beyond the dance event there are rumors of a St. Andrews in November but as of yet no official proposals. I Hope to have a proposal soon. Its also time to start coming up with Ideas for fall and winter, October commons, a Yule revel in December, a winter event for 2005 and perhaps a alternative to Pennsic commons in August. I'd really like to see more baronial commons type activities. In my opinion there should be some type of in persona local gathering every month, at least an event and two commons a quarter. Commons are easy they don't have to be structured and planed like events. They don't need a hall or a rented site, they can be held in ones home as a in persona party or BBQ. Food can be not at all, pot luck, host organized, host prepared, or even catered. The key elements are that it be open to the entire populous and inexpensive. By in expensive I mean be paid for by donations and collections and require little if any in the way of baronial funding. Keep in mind that Baronial events and commons must be proposed at an autocrats meeting for approval by the Seneschal and Coronet and expenditures of more than \$20.00 must be approved by a populous tally of all present when the proposal is made and may be vetoed by coronet, seneschal, or exchequer. Autocrats meetings are conducted as part of the populous forum which is the meeting held the first Thursday of most months. Also as a matter of seneschals' policy I will no longer approve any events without at least 3 months notice or any commons the same month as it is proposed.

As it is now June we are now using the new meeting format and terms. This means that the first meeting each month is now the populous forum and the second is an officers meeting. The populous forum will encompass an autocrats meeting, a planning meeting, and a policy meeting. Also as a matter of seneschals' policy, I will require all expenditures to be formally proposed at the populous forum. Any non essential expenditure proposed at any other meeting will be tabled until it can be proposed at a populous forum. My reasoning for this is simple. Our policy requires a populous tally and only the consultation of officers present. That makes the populous forum the correct venue and allows those interested in how the money gets spent to plan accordingly. The officers meetings will remain largely unchanged.
