MEETING DIRECTIONS

Sachem Public Library in Holbrook: From the west: LIE to exit 61. Go across Patchogue-Holbrook Rd. and stay on the service road. *At the first light past Patchogue-Holbrook make a left. This is Holbrook Road. The Library is about a 1/2mile down on the left, across from an elementary school. Go in and ask for the Boardroom. From the East: Take the LIE to exit 61. At the light for Patchogue-Holbrook Road make a left and go over the LIE. At the end of the bridge make a left onto the service road, follow from * above.

Connetquot Public Library in Bohemia From the West: Take Sunrise Highway (Rte 27) to Exit 47, Go to Ocean Avenue and make Left. From the East: Take Sunrise highway to Exit 49 (Lakeland Avenue). Go to Ocean Avenue and make a right. The Library in on the Left

Riverhead Free Library: The library is located at 330 Court Street, Riverhead. From the West: Take your best route to the Long Island Expressway east bound to Exit 72. Stay to your right following the signs to Route 25 east to Riverhead. Route 25 will become West Main Street. The Library will be visible from West Main Street. Turn left onto Osborn Avenue after you pass the library on West Main Street. Library parking can be found on your left before the railroad tracks. From the East: Take your best route to either Route 25 from the North Fork into Riverhead. This will become East Main Street and then West Main Street after you pass Peconic Ave. Turn right onto Osborn Avenue. Library parking will be on your left before the railroad tracks. OR Take your best route to Route 24 from the South Fork to the traffic circle in Riverhead. Take your first right out of the traffic circle onto Peconic Avenue. Turn left at the traffic light onto West Main Street. Turn right onto Osborn Ave. Library parking will be on your left before the railroad tracks. By the LIRR: The Riverhead Train Station is a short walk to the library. As you exit the train turn right heading west on Railroad Street. Cross Osborn Ave. and turn left heading south on Osborn Ave. The library will be on your right.

824 Middle Road, Riverhead: Take the Long Island Expressway (Interstate 495) east to exit 73. Merge onto CR 58 heading east. Turn left onto Harrison Ave. At the "T" intersection, turn right onto Middle Road. #824 will be on your left (north side of the road).

East Northport Library – 185 Larkfield Road, just North of Pulaski Road on the East side of the street. Parking is available behind the Library, turn onto Kew Avenue and make your first right onto University Place. We will meet in the Café.

St. Andrew's German Vacation

St. Andrew apologizes for being late this year. He was wandering south of Scandinavia and found a regional party that he had to attend, it ended up lasting a month. St. Andrew wishes to introduce us to this concept by hosting what the locals in Germania call an Octoberfest. A day of sausage and all things German on the annual day celebrating the birthday of the Barony of an Dubhaigeainn run and hosted by their most excellent Canton of Sandmork.

St. Andrew will sponsor a polearm and two-handed sword tourney to open the fighting, minimum length of the Polearm is 6 feet or as tall as the gentle wielding it, there are no restrictions on the two-handed swords. After the completion of the tourney there will be the Annual Baronial Champions heavy list, sponsored and run by the current Champion Baron Richard of Richard of Lough Ree. The details of the champion requirements are simple, be a member of the barony and a win the competition set forth by Baron Richard, format to be announced on site. After the Champion tourney there will be a heavy list for everyone following the champions list featuring the "Wheel of Arms". This random weapons list has proven itself both fun and challenging in the past and we look forward to an entertaining and diverse fighting afternoon. If there is interest in Saber or Rapier competition, an area indoors will be set aside.

The dayboard will be a hearty fare of German dishes. Upon clearing the Reeve, you will receive coins that you use to buy your food for the day. Those that stay for the evening feast will receive free access to the dayboard and after court will sit to a treat of handmade period German sausages made by local accomplished cooks and something called a strudel.

St. Andrew would love to see a German themed Arts and Science display, and those wishing to teach German themed classes are encouraged to talk to St. Andrews contact for the event, Master Ateno of Annun Ridge. German themed games are hoped to be played in the hall, if you have ideas for these please contact Ateno. Also if you plan on merchanting, contact Ateno.

Your cook for the event is Lord Nicodemus Grey. He would like to remind all gentles that the focus for the feast and dayboard will be simple German Octoberfest food. So those with aversion to or dietary restrictions of sausage and sauerkraut and similar items, should perhaps plan to bring their own meal. The site is discreetly damp, only beer, mead and wine in separate and period drinking containers.

Directions:

By Train: Take the Long Island Railroad to the Northport train station (The Port Jefferson Line). Taxis are available to get you to the site.

By Car: From the East: Take the Long Island Expressway (I-495) to Exit 53 and go to Commack Road (CR 4). At Commack Road, go right, heading north on Commack Road. ** Go to Jericho Turnpike (Rt. 25) and go left, heading west (there is a White Castle on the north-east corner). Take Jericho Turnpike to Larkfield Road and make a right, heading north (There is a Barnes and Noble on the right corner). Take Larkfield Road to Burr Road and turn right. The site is on the corner of Larkfield and Burr Roads.

From the West: Take the Long Island Expressway (I-495) to Exit 52, Commack Road CR 4). At Commack Road, go left, heading north on Commack Road. Continue from ** above.
