I came across a very large tome "The Italian Renaissance Interior 1400-1600" by Peter Thornton

What drew me to the book was as I thumbed threw the book designs,artwork and sketches.

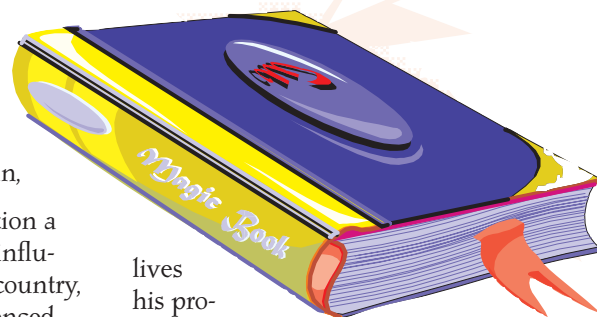
Whole ideas I never knew where period. That hanging metal pipe to make a fancy bed by DIY style its period. Rolling mobile room heaters – period for a few examples. There is just so much in this book I can't write it all down. While this book's title is Interior. Its really about everything soup to nuts a person used in life. In there home, tent ,even out door patio. So there are sketches for tools for the kitchen. Bowls, pitchers and boxes for the bedroom, To fabric of all types to mention a few things. Are all talked about and shown.

Ah, not an Italian persona no problem. This book tells you about other countries as well. Spain,

Germany and England to mention a few. How their designs and ideas influenced Italy. It also tells how each country, town, city as well as money influenced everything. From a design a carpenter carved on a bed, fabric, etc., to how you where painted in your portraits.

Calligrapher's and people looking for garb ideas will find something new and interesting in this books artwork too.

The Author tells you early on while art-work is helpful in unraveling some of the mysteries of how and why something was made and used. It was the Artist like the Bard who romanticized or even removed things. So like a storybook what you see, may not be all it seems. Best yet its author Peter Thornton at the time of printing 1991 .Was Curator of Sir John Soane's Museum in London and before that he worked at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London. From his Preface and Acknowledgement you learn he is a man that really



lives his profession. He used his vast contacts and traveled around the world to research his work. So if you really choose to you could trace back to document your work. Not just quote this book as a resource. As paintings, sketches and artwork are labeled, dated, even given the museum at which they where at. His note section is also helpful for this.

Of course with all good things there is a problem. I of course falling in love with the book for a resource wanted to purchase a copy. I could find it buts it is too costly for our pocket. So I would suggest if there is something about the book you like photocopy it for home/personal use. We need to respect copyright law after all. As I said this is a big book. Don't let it scare you off!!! Instead let the art work, sketches and designs excite and invite you into it.
