Trial by Axe:

Your Lady has been accused of Improper behavior you must defend her virtue by showing all that she is not guilty by the true proof of her innocence. You must throw your trusty axe and cut off her Braids from her head if you succeed she is innocent if you fail (Axe to the Head) she is guilty.

Brewing contest rules for Arrows and Ales.

The judging will be held in two separate categories.

The first category will be for those 'Vaguely Medieval' brews. This covers those brews that could have been brewed in period. They will be judged in the manner of the East Kingdom Brewers Guild, but in an unofficial capacity. Recipes are not required but encouraged. Those recipes written in a period manner will be given extra consideration.

The other category will be for anything else the brewer wishes to enter. All brews for this category are required to be named with at least the style the brewer is wishing to emulate, extra points are given for interesting and unique names. The brews will be judged directly by taste in relation to the style the brewer names.

The judge (Ateno) will name two or three (depending on number of entries) of the top in each category. Then a select group will be asked to taste and name a winner in each category.

Fencing Tourney

Whose Wine is it Any Way?

This tourney shall take place in the Clan MacEanraig tavern, the Bloody Kneecap. This is a team event, everyone gets a NICE prize, with an amusing twist...

There are two taverns, vying for the honor of supplying drink to the Crown, and to get that honor, both taverns are moving stock across town to the higher class location of the Bloody Kneecap. However, any means to usurp new ownership from rivals is well within the grasp of our street wise rapier wielding ruffians, and well sponsored fencers fight better. And, the tavern owner expects a fair amount of broken bottles...

All fencers are encouraged to get a Patron of the Drinking Arts. This person will sponsor the fencer by making a donation in good faith, showing their support for their chosen champion (any dollar value is welcome). They will later share in any spoils LOST in the competition and get a choice of any broken bottles! There is a suggested limit of one Patron per Fencer, and anyone of legal drinking age can be a sponsor.

The tourney will start with all fencers facing off against each other in a round robin, 5 bouts each. Fencers will be on their honor to fight each other in separate duels with whatever combinations of weapons they choose, total of 5 bouts each, to the death. Total scores will be tallied based on total wins, double kills count as a loss to each fencer. Each fencer will get ranked based on total wins, and get to choose in rank order from the private stock of Clan MacEanraig a bottle for safe transportation. For the purpose of this game, assume that all bottles are kept safe on your person and you do not have to reveal to anyone what you are carrying.

Next phase, the top ranked fencer will be paired with the lowest ranked fencer, then the #2 will be paired with the next lowest ranked and so on. If there is an odd fencer, they must fight alone. Each fencer must give the bottle they chose to their teammate for safeguarding. Each team then fights all other teams with attention to the following: total number of offensive weapons must be equal per side (minimum of one), and total number of defensive weapons must be equal per side (minimum of one). The team with the lowest ranking lead fencer chooses the weapons combination. Each team must duel the other teams for ownership of the bottles you possess: if you disarm (wound both hands/arms) or kill an opponent, you get ONE bottle they hold (a bottle won from a killed fencer is cracked, as below). Winning teams decide who possesses the new bottle, and once declared, you cannot exchange/share bottles. If you kill an opponent, the bottle(s) in their possession is assumed cracked, and broken if the new owner is killed (the bottle's second death) and nobody gets it yet. The teams fight until ONE belligerent is disarmed or dead and there will be No Holds Called to exchange weapons in hand. The first death is the one that counts in terms of double kills or disarm/kill. If a fencer is without a bottle, they must choose from those left in the Tavern to carry into the next bout if any are left.

At the end, each team gets to reveal the bottles they have and fencers can CHOOSE to reclaim ONE bottle their teammate possesses. They are to return unclaimed bottles to the Tavern, if any. Fencers who have not claimed a prize must wait until the end, with choosing a returned bottle being based on INVERSE RANK order. Any bottles declared as broken in the competition will be claimed by your Patrons, based upon RANK order of their sponsored Fencer. And, it would be good to see sharing the spoils with your Patrons!
